Question: Why are sea stars hard to find? Why are micro plastics a risk to sea creatures?

Join Ucluelet Aquarium naturalists alternate Fridays to explore amazing tidepools. Tiny creatures will steal your heart. Our Trail Ambassador will also visit critters seen according to the tides. Rocks are not toddler friendly (*wear sturdy shoes*).
